## Eastern Illinois University School of Communication and Journalism Assistant Professor Position Announcement

The School of Communication and Journalism at Eastern Illinois University seeks an individual whose primary duties are that of basic course director. The basic course at EIU (CMN 1310G: Introduction to Speech Communication) is a foundational course required in the general education curriculum. The basic course director is responsible for the oversight of curriculum, representing the basic course on university committees and councils, and supervising approximately 30 sections of the basic course per year. This supervision includes mentoring and instructing graduate teaching assistants assigned to teach the course.

In addition to this primary duty the candidate will be expected to teach courses in the division core and in their area of expertise. Opportunities for summer employment exist for candidates who have an interest in teaching online. Academic advising, service assignments, research/creative, and professionally related activities are expected. This tenure-track appointment is at the assistant professor level.

## Qualifications

Ph.D. in Communication is required by start of employment. Evidence of a clear research agenda and excellent teaching are required along with strong interpersonal, collaborative, and organizational skills. Preference will be given to candidates whose teaching experience and/or research interests include one or more of the following: race, gender, interpersonal communication, organizational communication, and mass communication - all methodological approaches will be considered. Successful candidates will demonstrate an interest teaching online courses, and the ability to teach graduate courses in their area of expertise. Demonstrated commitment to diversity and experience with promoting inclusive excellence is required.

Review of applications will begin Nov. 1, 2019 and will continue until campus interviews are scheduled.
